THEME

- made up of 3 lines,
each a complete sentence
composed of exactly
3 words each

(d:it:o)
(dit:to)

- two formats to choose from
for each sentence:

- Noun verb noun.
- Adjective noun verb. ↗ OR ↘

- avoid proper nouns (Jane,
Elsinore, Victor, the North Pole)

- use concrete nouns (scientist)
in favor of abstract (science)

- use carefully-chosen, specific
verbs and adjectives, not
generic ones (sad, go, leaves)

- communicate the narrative in
a meaningful way (chronologically
usually works best) with no
analysis or interpretation

- use abstract nouns (honesty)
in favor of concrete ones

- carefully choose words that
capture some specific
aspect of the work's
meaning

- mimic the structure of
the PLÖT 3x3 so that the
two complement each other
and help clarify how the
narrative mirrors the meaning
- avoid plot summary of
any kind (that's the point
of the PLÖT 3x3); instead
focus on meaning purely

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
