26. superfluous (adj.) – not needed, or more than is needed; exceeding what is sufficient or necessary; extravagant to the point of being wasteful

27. egregious (adj.) – extremely bad or shocking in an obvious way; conspicuously or flagrantly bad

28. turbulent (adj.) – describes a time or situation that is filled with sudden changes, arguments, or violence; causing unrest or disturbance; characterized by agitation or chaos

29. unobtrusive (adj.) – not attracting attention; not blatant or aggressive; inconspicuous; not noticeable or prominent

30. acquiesce (v.) – to agree to something, often when one does not want to; to accept, comply, or submit passively to

31. elucidate (v.) – to explain something, or make it clear; to give a clarifying explanation or analysis; to literally shed light on

32. succinct (adj.) – said in a very clear way using only a few words; brief and precisely expressed without wasted words

33. frivolous (adj.) – behaving in a silly way and not taking anything seriously; describes an activity or object that is silly or not important rather than useful or serious; of little weight or importance; having no sound basis; lacking in seriousness; silly in a negative way

34. propensity (n.) – the fact that someone is likely to behave in a particular way, especially a bad way; an often intense natural inclination or preference

35. ostentatious (adj.) – too obviously showing one's money, possessions, or power, in an attempt to get admiration from and be noticed by others; marked by or fond of conspicuous or vainglorious and sometimes pretentious display
