S	SPEAKER: What can you infer or assume about the poet? ... What can you tell or what do you know about the speaker that helps you understand the point of view expressed?	
P	PURPOSE: What is the narrator/poet hoping to accomplish? What is the reason behind this piece? What do they want the audience to do after having listened?	
A	AUDIENCE: Who is the speaker/writer trying to reach? How do we know? Do they indicate a specific audience? What assumptions exist in the text about the intended audience?	
C	CONTEXT: What is the time and place of this piece? What is happening in the world as it relates to the subject of the speech or the speaker/writer?	
E	EXIGENCE: What was the spark or catalyst that moved the speaker/writer to act/write? How did that event impact the speaker/writer?	
C	CHOICES: What are the rhetorical choices that the storyteller makes in the poem? Think about overall structure, imagery, diction, symbolism, figurative language, etc.	
A	APPEALS: Which of the three rhetorical appeals (ethos, logos, pathos) are present in the text? Where? Why?	
T	tone: What is the poet's attitude toward the subject? Is the tone the same throughout the whole piece? Where does it shift? What evidence is there to demonstrate the tone?
