You'll need to explain how Shakespeare's Macbeth and Achebe's Things Fall Apart both develop common theme. You'll be asked to compare and contrast how these two works explore an aspect of the human experience.

You should consider, in advance, how each work speaks to various parts of the human experience. Some thematic concepts you may consider exploring in the mini-essay include (but are not at all limited to) those listed on the chart paper posted in class.

Your multi-paragraph response should include:

- an opening sentence that makes a clear claim
- an argument focused on theme, not plot summary
- a reasonable comparison of how the two works express some common ideas
- a reasonable contrast of how the two works differ in their handling of a thematic idea
- solid textual support including at least one properly woven, cited quotation from each work
