PREPARATION FOR CLASS DISCUSSION: DUALITIES IN THE METAMORPHOSIS

Your goal is to lead your peers in answering the following question: *Discuss the interplay between ONE of the following dualities in the novella:*

logic (instinct)/emotion order/chaos sleep/waking strength/weakness starvation/nourishment light/darkness silence/sound cleanliness/filth reward/punishment

To accomplish this task, please plan to address the four points below:

- 1.) Comment on the scope and/or progression of the duality.
- 2.) Located two key references that demonstrate the duality. Be ready to explain these references to the class. Include the function of these references.
- 3.) Determine a theme that the interplay of the duality develops.
- 4.) Develop one thoughtful question to pose the class that insights conversation about your duality.

Consider the following:

- Be ready to <u>speak</u> and contribute to a class discussion.
- Take care to discuss your ideas with each other before the class discussion so that you're on the same page and so that each group member has new information to share: avoid unnecessary repetition.

I'll be looking for the following in the class discussion:

- Coherence/structure: How well does your analysis flow? Is there a discernible logic to the order in which you presented your ideas? Did everyone contribute? Were all points listed above addressed?
- Quality/depth of information: Did the group engage with the text on a superficial and rushed manner, or was there evidence of a comprehensive study of the novella? Were the key references appropriate and thoroughly explained?
- **Analysis**: Did the group's ideas go beyond description to include analytical connection of ideas and nuances? Was the function of the duality identified?
- **Text references:** Did the group back up their claims with direct references to the text, including page numbers?
