Authorial choices are present and accurately highlighted blue on the hardcopy in all paragraphs; each choice should be pulled from your approved/attached outline and when featured in body paragraphs must include the author's last name, a suitable LPT analytical verb, and a specific feature/element/device (with a strong preference for features from the pre-notes) to be considered complete.

Complete, accurately highlighted authorial choices are missing in one or more paragraphs: it could be that there is no single-sentence thesis statement in the intro that previews these choices, that a body paragraph is missing clear discussion of the author's actions, or that the conclusion lacks any review of the author's craft.

Your highlighted commentary explains how some — but not all — of your provided evidence supports the argument of your thesis statement.

Your highlighted commentary mostly just summarizes or restates the plot but doesn't explain how that evidence supports the argument of the thesis.

Your essay (both the colorcoded hardcopy and the black-andwhite digital submission) is in full MLA format.

## MECHANICS
